## **Vigil Mechanism / Whistle Blower / Ethics Escalation Policy**

### **1. PREFACE**

Pursuant to Section 177 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other applicable provisions of Listing Agreement, every listed Company and other Large Public Companies shall establish a Whistle Blower policy / Vigil Mechanism / Ethics Escalation for the Directors and Employees to report genuine concerns or grievances about unethical behavior, actual or suspected fraud or violation of the Company's Code of Conduct or Ethics Policy. The Company has adopted a Code of Conduct for Directors and Senior Management Executives ("the Code"), which lays down the principles and standards that should govern the actions of the Company and its employees. Any actual or potential violation of the Code, howsoever insignificant or perceived as such, would be a matter of serious concern for the Company. Such a vigil mechanism shall provide for adequate safeguards against victimization of directors and employees who avail of such mechanism and also make provisions for direct access to the Chairperson of Audit Committee in exceptional cases. Under these circumstances, Guru Nanak Auto Enterprises Limited, being a Public Company proposes to establish a Whistle Blower Policy/ Vigil Mechanism and to formulate a policy for the same.

### **2. POLICY OBJECTIVES**

The Company is committed to adhere to the highest standards of ethical, moral and legal conduct of business operations. To maintain these standards, the Company encourages its employees who have concerns about suspected misconduct to come forward and express these concerns without fear of punishment or unfair treatment. A Vigil (Whistle Blower) mechanism provides a channel to the Employees and Directors to report to the management concerns about unethical behavior, actual or suspected fraud or violation of the Code of Conduct or legal or regulatory requirements, incorrect or misrepresentation of any financial statements and reports, etc.

### **3. SCOPE OF THE POLICY**

This Policy intends to cover serious concerns that could have grave impact on the operations and performance of the business of the Company and malpractices and events

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which have taken place / suspected to have taken place, misuse or abuse of authority, fraud or suspected fraud, violation of Company rules, manipulations, negligence causing danger to public health and safety, misappropriation of monies, Criminal offenses, including financial improprieties, fraud, bribery and corruption, Failure to comply with any legal obligation, statutory requirement, Any other issue of a serious nature that does not fit into the categories defined above and other matters or activity on account of which the interest of the Company is affected and formally reported by whistle blowers concerning its employees.

The policy neither releases employees from their duty of confidentiality in the course of their work, nor is it a route for raising malicious allegations about a personal situation.

#### **4. DEFINITIONS**

- 4.1 “Audit Committee” means the Audit Committee constituted by the Board of Directors of the Company.
- 4.2 “Employee” means every employee of the Company, including the Directors in the employment of the Company.
- 4.3 “Protected Disclosure” means a concern raised by a written communication made in good faith that discloses or demonstrates information that may evidence unethical or improper activity. Protected Disclosures should be factual and not speculative in nature.
- 4.4 “Code” mean Conduct for Directors and Senior Management Personnel adopted by Guru Nanak Auto Enterprises Limited.
- 4.5 “Subject” means a person against or in relation to whom a Protected Disclosure has been made or evidence gathered during the course of an investigation.
- 4.6 “Whistle Blower” means an Employee making a Protected Disclosure under this Policy.
- 4.7 “Company” means Guru Nanak Auto Enterprises Limited.

#### **5. ELIGIBILITY**

All employees of the Company and various stakeholders, consultants of the Company are eligible to make Protected Disclosures under the Policy in relation to matters concerning the Company.



## **6. RECEIPT AND DISPOSAL OF PROTECTED DISCLOSURES**

- 6.1 All Protected Disclosures should be reported in writing by the complainant as soon as possible after the Whistle Blower becomes aware of the same so as to ensure a clear understanding of the issues raised and should either be typed or written in a legible handwriting in English.
- 6.2 The Protected Disclosure should be submitted in a closed and secured envelope and should be super scribed as “Protected disclosure under the Whistle Blower policy”. Alternatively, the same can also be sent through email with the subject “Protected disclosure under the Whistle Blower policy”. If the complaint is not super scribed and closed as mentioned above, it will not be possible for the Audit Committee to protect the complainant and the protected disclosure will be dealt with as if a normal disclosure. In order to protect identity of the complainant, the Chairman of the Audit Committee will not issue any acknowledgement to the complainants and they are advised neither to write their name/address on envelop nor enter into any further Correspondence with the Chairman of the Audit Committee. Chairman of the Audit Committee shall assure that in case any further clarification is required, he will get in touch with the complainant.
- 6.3 The Company shall not entertain anonymous/ pseudonymous disclosures.
- 6.4 The Protected Disclosure should be forwarded under a covering letter signed by the complainant. The Chairman of the Audit Committee shall detach the covering letter bearing the identity of the Whistle Blower and process only the Protected Disclosure.
- 6.5 All Protected Disclosures should be addressed to the Chairman of the Audit Committee.
- 6.6 Protected Disclosure against the Chairman of the Company should be addressed to the Chairman of the Audit Committee.
- 6.7 Protected Disclosure against the Chairman of the Audit Committee should be addressed to any Executive Director.
- 6.8 On receipt of the protected disclosure, the Chairman of the Audit Committee shall make a record of the Protected Disclosure and also ascertain from the complainant whether he was the person who made the protected disclosure or not. The record will include:

- ❖ Brief facts;
- ❖ Whether the same Protected Disclosure was raised previously by anyone, and if so, the outcome thereof;
- ❖ Whether the same Protected Disclosure was raised previously on the same subject;
- ❖ Details of actions taken by Chairman for processing the complaint;

- ❖ Findings of the Audit Committee;
- ❖ The recommendations of the Audit Committee/ other action(s)
- ❖ The Audit Committee, if deems fit, may call for further information or particulars from the complainant.

## **7. INVESTIGATION**

- 7.1 All Protected Disclosures reported under this Policy will be thoroughly investigated by the Chairman of the Audit Committee who will investigate / oversee the investigations under the authorization of the Audit Committee. Chairman of Audit Committee may at its discretion consider involving any investigators for the purpose of Investigation.
- 7.2 The decision to conduct an investigation taken into a Protected Disclosure by itself is not an acceptance of the accusation by the Authority and is to be treated as a neutral fact-finding process because the outcome of the investigation may or may not support accusation.
- 7.3 The identity of a Subject will be kept confidential to the extent possible given the legitimate needs of the investigation.
- 7.4 Unless there are compelling reasons not to do so, Subjects will be given reasonable opportunity for hearing their side during the investigation. No allegation of wrongdoing against a Subject shall be considered as maintainable unless there is good evidence in support of the allegation.
- 7.5 Subjects shall have a duty to co-operate with the Audit Committee during investigation to the extent that such co-operation sought does not merely require them to admit guilt.
- 7.6 Subjects shall have right to access any document/ information for their legitimate need to clarify/ defend themselves in the investigation proceedings.
- 7.7 Subjects shall have a responsibility not to interfere with the investigation. Evidence shall not be withheld, destroyed or tampered with, and witnesses shall not be influenced, coached, threatened or intimidated by the Subjects.
- 7.8 Subjects have a right to be informed of the outcome of the investigation. If allegations are not sustained, the Subjects shall be consulted as to whether public disclosure of the investigation results would be in the best interest of the Subject and the Company.
- 7.9 Chairman of the Audit Committee shall normally complete the investigation within 90 days of the receipt of protected disclosure.
- 7.10 In case of allegations against subject are substantiated by the Chairman of the Audit Committee in his report, the Audit Committee shall give an opportunity to Subject to explain his side.

## **8. DECISION AND REPORTING**

If an investigation leads to a conclusion that an improper or unethical act has been committed, the Chairman of the Audit Committee shall recommend to the Board of Directors of the Company to take such disciplinary or corrective action as it may deem fit.' Any disciplinary or corrective action initiated against the Subject as a result of the findings of an investigation pursuant to this Policy shall adhere to the applicable personnel or staff conduct and disciplinary procedures.

A quarterly report with number of complaints received under the Policy and their outcome shall be placed before the Audit Committee and the Board.

## **9. PROTECTION**

- 9.1 No unfair treatment will be meted out to a Whistle Blower by virtue of his/ her having reported a Protected Disclosure under this policy. The Company, as a policy, condemns any kind of discrimination, harassment, victimization or any other unfair employment practice being adopted against Whistle Blowers. Complete protection will, therefore, be given to Whistle Blowers against any unfair practice like retaliation, threat or intimidation of termination / suspension of service, disciplinary action, transfer, demotion, refusal of promotion or the like including any direct or indirect use of authority to obstruct the Whistle Blower's right to continue to perform his duties / functions including making further Protected Disclosure. The Company will take steps to minimize difficulties, which the Whistle Blower may experience as a result of making the Protected Disclosure. Thus, if the Whistle Blower is required to give evidence in criminal or disciplinary proceedings, the Company will arrange for the Whistle Blower to receive advice about the procedure, etc. A Whistle Blower may report any violation of the above clause to the Chairman of the Audit Committee, who shall investigate into the same and recommend suitable action to the management.
- 9.2 The identity of the Whistle Blower shall be kept confidential to the extent possible and permitted under law.
- 9.3 Any other Employee assisting in the said investigation shall also be protected to the same extent as the Whistle Blower.

## **10. SECRECY / CONFIDENTIALITY**

The Complainant, Chairman of the Audit Committee, Members of Audit Committee, the Subject and everybody involved in the process shall:

- 10.1 Maintain confidentiality of all matters under this Policy.
- 10.2 Discuss only to the extent or with those persons as required under this policy for completing the process of investigations.
- 10.3 Not keep the papers unattended anywhere at any time.
- 10.4 Keep the electronic mails / files under password.

## **11. DECISION**

- 11.1 If an investigation leads to a conclusion that an improper or unethical act has been committed, the Chairman of the Audit Committee shall recommend to the management of the Company to take such disciplinary or corrective action as he may deem fit. It is clarified that any disciplinary or corrective action initiated against the Subject as a result of the findings of an investigation pursuant to this Policy shall adhere to the applicable personnel or staff conduct and disciplinary procedures.
- 11.2 If the report of investigation is not to the satisfaction of the complainant, the complainant has the right to report the event to the appropriate legal or investigating agency. A complainant who makes false allegations of unethical & improper practices or about alleged wrongful conduct of the subject to the Audit Committee shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary action in accordance with the rules, procedures and policies of the Company.

## **12. ACCESS TO CHAIRMAN OF THE AUDIT COMMITTEE**

The Whistle Blower shall have right to access Chairman of the Audit Committee directly in exceptional cases and the Chairman of the Audit Committee is authorized to prescribe suitable directions in this regard.

## **13. COMMUNICATION**

A Whistle Blower Policy cannot be effective unless it is properly communicated to employees. The policy should be published on the website of the Company.



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**14. RETENTION OF DOCUMENTS**

All Protected disclosures in writing or documented along with the results of Investigation relating thereto, shall be retained by the Company / Head of Legal and Compliance for a period of 7 (seven) years or such other period as specified by any other law in force, whichever is more.

**15. AMENDMENT**

The Company reserves its right to amend or modify this Policy in whole or in part, at any time without assigning any reason whatsoever. However, no such amendment or modification will be binding on the employees and directors unless the same is notified to them in writing.
